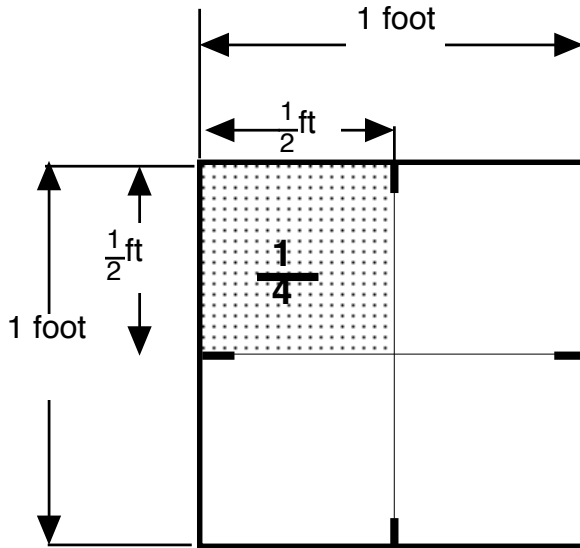


# Multiplying Fractions 1

$$\frac{1}{2} \times \frac{1}{2} = \frac{1}{4}$$

$$\frac{1}{4} \times \frac{1}{2}$$

$$\frac{7}{9} \times \frac{9}{12}$$

$$\frac{1}{2} \times \frac{4}{12}$$

$$\frac{1}{12} \times \frac{1}{12}$$

$$\frac{2}{5} \times \frac{3}{9}$$

$$\frac{4}{6} \times \frac{2}{3}$$

$$\frac{7}{9} \times \frac{4}{6}$$

$$\frac{1}{24} \times \frac{16}{32}$$

$$\frac{4}{6} \times \frac{1}{2}$$

$$\frac{5}{6} \times \frac{5}{7}$$

$$\frac{9}{12} \times \frac{8}{14}$$

$$\frac{1}{22} \times \frac{8}{9}$$

$$\frac{8}{9} \times \frac{7}{8}$$

$$\frac{4}{5} \times \frac{7}{8}$$

$$\frac{1}{6} \times \frac{3}{4}$$

$$\frac{4}{16} \times \frac{2}{5}$$

$$\frac{1}{2} \times \frac{1}{4}$$

$$\frac{2}{2} \times \frac{1}{4}$$

$$\frac{1}{3} \times \frac{1}{2}$$

$$\frac{7}{32} \times \frac{8}{9}$$
