Grammar: Adverbs

An **adverb** is a word that usually describes a verb. Adverbs tell *how*, *when*, or *where* an action happens. Many adverbs end with *-ly*.

## adverbs

**how:** They played the music **loudly**.

**when:** He came **early**.

**where:** He went **inside**.
